School Uniform Dress Code Policy



RATIONALE:

We believe that wearing a recognised school uniform will:

- develop a sense of prestige and belonging in students.
- develop public recognition of our students.
- further develop our image.
- ensure a good standard of dress and presentation.

Clothing should be comfortable, appropriate to the weather and be representative of our school.

PROCEDURES:

DRESS CODE

- Students will be encouraged to wear, and be responsible for, their school uniform.
- Students will keep their appearance neat and tidy at all times.
- Wearing cosmetic make-up and nail polish is unacceptable.
- Excessive or potentially dangerous jewellery is unacceptable.
- School uniform is to be worn during excursions/functions unless the activity makes this inappropriate.
- Suitable footwear must be worn at all times. Backless shoes, thongs and high heels are unacceptable.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Our school uniform consists of bottle green/white/grey/gold clothing.

GIRLS: Bottle green skirt or skort.
Bottle green/white check dress.
Bottle green broad brimmed hat.
Bottle green jumper/windcheater.
Bottle green, gold or white socks.
Plain bottle green, grey or black pants, track pants or medium length shorts.
Gold or bottle green polo shirt or skivvy.
Checked pinafore.
Long checked skirt.

BOYS: Grey, green or gold shirt or skivvy.
Green, white or grey socks.
Bottle green broad brimmed hat.
Bottle green jumper/windcheater.
Plain bottle green, grey or black pants, track pants or medium length shorts..

N.B. Pants and shorts are not to have stripes, large writing or large logos on them.
Lock Roos or sporting tops or jumpers are not part of the school uniform.

CLOTHING FOR SPECIALISED ACTIVITIES

Physical Education

Girls – Skirt, skort, shorts or pants/runners with a T-shirt, or a tracksuit
Boys - Sports shorts or tracksuit with a T-shirt.

Sports Day and Swimming Carnival

On Sports Day and Swimming Carnival students are expected to wear a T-shirt indicating their team colours with shorts, skirt or runners and appropriate footwear and clothing. No coloured hairspray or writing on the skin is permitted. Team coloured zinc cream on the face is permissible. Costumes are not permitted.

Interschool Sports Day - green and gold uniform supplied by the school.

Art/Tech

For Years R-3 a garment will be provided by the school and must be worn. For Years 4-12 an apron is supplied.

Closed in shoes must be worn by Secondary students.

Home Technology

An apron to protect school uniform is provided.

N.B. In accordance with D.E.C.D. policy closed in shoes and other PPE (personal protective equipment) will be worn in the following areas:

- Technical Studies Centre
- Home Technology Centre
- Art Centre
- Science Laboratory

Swimming Activities

Follow swimming pool regulations. A t-shirt or rashie must be worn.

LOST CLOTHING

Lost student clothing will be kept in the Staffroom and be supervised by a Parents & Friends nominee. Items not claimed after the first Parents & Friends meeting in the following term will be disposed of in the most appropriate manner.

It is the responsibility of the families to name/rename all pieces of school clothing. This includes underwear during swimming lessons.

HATS

During Terms 1 and 4 hats are required during recess, lunch and during outdoor activities (unless directed by teachers). Students are to wear a bottle green broad-brimmed hat.

Hats are not to be worn in class. Appropriate beanies may be worn in terms 2 & 3 before school and during lunch and recess time only.
