Covid-19 Update

We look forward to a busy term with some of the restrictions being lifted and activities opening up for us. School sport will now take place and we will be participating in some of these throughout the term.

We have several safety and hygiene standards in place to assist in reducing the risk of infection. Given the state of affairs with our neighbours in Victoria it is important that as a community we remain vigilant and follow the health advice.

Students who are unwell should remain at home until symptoms resolve or until you have consulted a health practitioner. Should students develop or present symptoms at school, families will be contacted and the child will be required to go home.

Requirements that remain in place

- Physical contact (even between students) must be limited. Non-physical greetings should be encouraged.
- The general public should not access school playgrounds or play equipment.
- **School drop-off and pick-up**
- Parents should maintain the 1.5m physical distance between themselves and other adults (parents and teachers) at all times, including school drop off and pick up.
- Practice good hygiene

The best way to stop the spread of illness is to practice good hygiene. We encourage all staff and students to:

- wash your hands regularly, particularly after using the toilet and before eating
- use alcohol based sanitiser – place it at the gate/service entrance for each parent and child to use on arrival
- cover a cough or sneeze with a tissue
- avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth and if you are unwell, stay home so you don't spread infections to others

Site closure management for COVID-19

Our department has well-practiced disaster and emergency management protocols and a clear process for reporting and managing notifiable diseases.

If a confirmed case of COVID-19 is identified in a staff member, student or child, SA Health will contact the site to confirm the presence of a case.

A REMINDER: If there is a confirmed case

In the event of a confirmed case, the site will be closed for a minimum of 24 hours and children will need to be picked up immediately.

Closure will allow public health officials to identify and notify any close contacts and advise on treatment and self-isolation. The site will also be subjected to a thorough clean. It will only reopen on the advice of health experts and when it is safe to do so.

In the event of a closure, parent communication materials will be distributed.

Please ensure we have your up to date email addresses and mobile phone numbers and I encourage you to download the School Stream App.

You will have received your child/ren's first semester report on the last day of Term 2. I hope you had time to read these with your child/ren to celebrate their achievements and make decisions about what they will focus on in Semester 2.
