NAPLAN

The annual NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) testing will occur between 11 and 21 May for all students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9. NAPLAN is a national test and helps to inform schools and parents about how students are doing at school. At Lock Area School we use this information and compare it with the PAT R and M (Progressive Achievement Tests Reading and Math) to ensure we are meeting students' academic needs. This helps to inform teachers when they are planning their units of work. It also helps to chart the growth that students have made and what work needs to be done into the future. It is crucial that the data is cross-referenced with our other data sources to ensure we have an accurate picture of student growth.

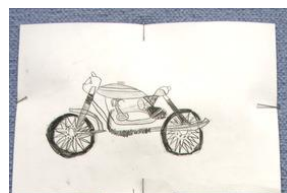
