ARCHER – Slowly I got my work done, though as the day went on I got sleepier and sleepier. Teams is similar to another platform I use.

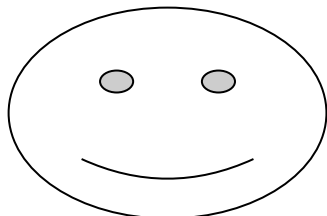
CAMERON – Early in Lockdown I couldn't wait to go back to school to see my friends. Quickly I finished my work so I could have some free time.
