This portal is specifically set up for the school using the unique 9-digit online ordering code (please follow the "how to order" step by step guide attached to the newsletter). Please note: this code can also be found on your order envelopes, and on the advanceaccess dashboard.

PARENTS WHO PLACE THEIR ORDER ONLINE DO NOT NEED TO RETURN THE ORDER ENVELOPE.

Only families who still wish to pay with cash will need to return the order envelope on the day. Family photo envelopes will be available for collection at the front office.







IT'S THE LAW!

In South Australia it is compulsory for ALL dogs and cats to be microchipped. Within 28 days of an owner taking All dogs and cats in the District Council possession; or; of Elliston must be registered in Dogs and Cats Online with the microchipping time, before the extension of time has details.

Microchipping

District Council of Elliston is committed to returning lost animals to their owners.

Microchipping is the most effective form of permanent identification for your dog or cat. Collars can come off or be removed, tags can fade or become outdated. Inserting a microchip means your pet can be easily identified by a Council Officer, animal shelter or veterinarian, regardless of the situation. Once identified, you can be contacted immediately and informed of the location of your pet. In South Australia it is compulsory for ALL dogs (including working dogs) and cats to be microchipped. ALL dogs AND cats in the District Council of Elliston must be registered in Dogs and Cats Online with the microchipping details.
