R/1 CLASS

Welcome to Bumblebees class, our name for our R/1 class. We have started the term with getting to know each other, learning through play both in class and with the Little Bees (Kindy), and exploring different aspects of the school values of being a Caring and Responsible class member.

We will look at the values of Fairness and Respect in the coming weeks. Playing with the Little Bees (Kindy) students help us to practice our fun learning with our Head, Heart and Hands.



This term in Writing we will be looking at what makes a sentence and how to develop them into interesting stories.

Daily, we read books and our own stories,

helping us to gain fluency and sounding out skills.

Our English unit – Goldilocks and the Three Bears, is a great way to look at how authors develop their characters and what these characters do. We have been practicing our handwriting each day to improve our letter formation, stay on the

line and use finger spacing between words.



During Maths we continue to identify numbers to 100 and how to use part:part:whole strategies to explore addition to 20, with extension to 50. Measuring lengths and heights will be our focus in the coming weeks, along with exploring 2D shapes in our environment.

Our Science and HASS focus will be embedded in our Schools Plus Project. We have combined with Yr2/3/4 class to look at both local farming practices and to look at local conservation. We have started with combining into learning teams. We have prepared the school veggie garden to grow some healthy foods to share later in the year. Looking at edible plants, pulses and local plants will help us understand our local environment better.

IT'S THE LAW!

In South Australia it is compulsory for ALL dogs and cats to be microchipped. Within 28 days of an owner taking All dogs and cats in the District Council possession; or; of Elliston must be registered in Dogs and Cats Online with the microchipping time, before the extension of time has

all sorts of reasons. So it's vital we know the situations when and why dogs bite and how we can interact with dogs safely.

- Always supervise children around dogs at home or in public.
- Never enter a dog's territory, like their bed, yard or toy box.

Safety tips:

- A Never touch a dog while it's eating.
- △ Never touch a dog's puppies without the owner's permission.
- A Never disturb a sleeping dog.
- A Never put your face near a dog's face.
- ▲ Teach children to always ask the owner's permission before approaching a dog.
- Dogs can bite when they're tired, frightened or annoyed.
- ⚠ When approaching a dog, slowly reach to touch its chest from the side. If it retreats, it's time to back off.
