

Indonesian: We have been learning and revising words for colours, numbers, jungle animals and food through lots of songs and activities... and linking with our Art lessons.



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
The Arts: We have been trying out different mediums such as crayon, paint, ink (calligraphy) and clay, testing out different ways that they can be used to create artworks.
