At the end of lunch filling their water bottles up to the brim,


Kids everywhere climbing trees like a sloth.


#### **Year 7-10 History – The Black Death**

This term in history students have been investigating the origin of the Black Death epidemic, the conditions that allowed it to spread and become so deadly as well as the effects on society as a result of the disease outbreak.

This dovetails with our learning in science very well as we have progressed from learning about the basics of the human body, to understanding human disease. As a result of their developed science knowledge, they have been able to understand why the disease was so deadly, and make recommendations about which of the medieval prevention and treatment strategies will be effective.

To further develop their understanding, we will play the Bristol to develop a sense of panic in trying to escape from plague ridden Bristol while trying to avoid catching the disease as they do.

As the secondary class progresses through the term, they will play other board games for science and maths to apply their learning, and hopefully cement these skills and understandings in a new and fun way.







#### **Year 5/6 Science – Living and Non-living**

This term the 5/6 class has been investigating the living and non-living portions of an environment. Their learning started with all of the aspects of an environment that impact our day to day lives that were non-living (such as sunshine, rain amount, soil type, shade) as well has the living portion (competition with other animal, predators and prey). They further developed this understanding by creating food chains. Now in the final portion of their term, they are working hard to create their own nature documentary, selecting behaviours of specific animals, and narrating them in the style of Sir David Attenborough. We aim to present these at the assembly in week 9 - certainly something to look forward to.


We are excited to be adding more locations this year! So, keep your eye out for those!
